IT'S TIME FOR **DIGNITY IN PAY**

People with disabilities want and deserve opportunities to work for at least minimum wage, in integrated employment settings. Dignity in pay matters to people with disabilities, just like everyone else.

WHAT IS THE SUBMINIMUM WAGE?

Under the Fair Labor Standards Act. employers can apply for and receive a 14(c) waiver which allows them to pay disabled workers less than minimum wage. In some cases, disabled workers can make, \$50 / cents an hour, or less than \$100 / month for a 40 hour work week.

PROVIDERS AND ADVOCATES ARE ADVANCING INNOVATION

Several Illinois disability providers have created innovative community integrated programs that work with people with disabilities. The Dignity in Pay Act supports this work by establishing a Transition Fund to support providers in moving away from subminimum wage.
